The Kvrie is a Greek word meaning "O Lord." It is a crv to the Lord for help and strength. In ancient times, the crowds would shout. "Lord. have mercy" as the king entered their town. The church has taken over this prayer to greet its King, Jesus Christ, in the church service.


As the people long ago expected help from their king, so we Christians expect blessings from our Savior.

THE CONFESSION AND ANNOUNCEMENT OF FORGIVENESS

 - C: we confess, as Your people, our sinful human nature and the thoughts, words, and actions that are evil in Your sight. We need Your rescue, righteousness, and a Redeemer. Mercifully draw near to us, O Lord. For the sake of Jesus Christ and His cross, rescue us from our troubles and cover our sin with true righteousness. Redeem our lives, that our days and deeds would be directed in Your peace. Amen.
- P: Almighty God, in His mercy, has given His Son, Jesus, to die for you, and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of the Word made flesh and by His authority, I therefore forgive You all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
 - C: Amen.


THE KYRIE

When we sing the **Hymn of Praise**, we join the ranks of the angels in heaven and the militant Christian church on earth, lining up behind Jesus to go into battle against the powers of hell itself. One of the best ways to defeat the devil and his legions is to sing praises to God and proclaim Jesus Christ. the Lamb of God. who takes away the sin of the world, who is now seated at the right hand of the Father in power.

"This is the Feast" is based on Rev. 5:12-13.

In the Collect. The pastor and congregation greet each other as the angel greeted Mary at her annunciation. (Luke 1:28) The phrase also indicates the special relationship between the pastor and the congregation.

K THE LOYALTY SUNDAY READINGS

2 Corinthians 9:6-7

- P: The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully.
- C: Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

Mark 12:41

- P: Jesus sat opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the offering box.
- C: Many rich people put in large sums.

Proverbs 3:9-10

- P: Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the firstfruits of all your produce;
- C: Then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine.

Luke 6:38

- P: Give and it will be given to you: Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over will be put into your lap.
- C: For with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you.

1 Corinthians 16:2

- P: On the first day of every week each one of you is to put something aside, and store it up, as he may prosper,
- C: So that there will be no collecting when I come.

Matthew 23:23

- P: Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness.
- C: These you ought to have done, without neglecting the others.

Proverbs 11:24-25

- P: One gives freely, yet grows all the richer; another withholds what he should give, and only suffers want.
- C: Whoever brings blessing will be enriched, and one who waters will himself be watered.

Psalm 76:11

- P: Make your vows to the Lord your God and perform them;
- C: Let all around him bring gifts to him who is to be feared,

2 Corinthians 8:7-8

- P: But as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all earnestness, and in our love for you—see that you excel in this act of grace also.
- C: I say this not as a command, but to prove by the earnestness of others that your love also is genuine.

The Gospel Verse may change weekly or the ordinary verse is from John 6:68. We rise for the Holy Gospel as we would stand for Jesus Himself, since the Gospel is His living Word to us.

The Holy Gospel Lesson is selected according to the season or festival Sunday of the Church Year, and is found on page 880 in the pew Bible.

THE GOSPEL LESSON Luke 21:5-19

P: The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the twenty-first chapter.



⁵ And while some were speaking of the temple, how it was adorned with noble stones and offerings, he said, ⁶ "As for these things that you see, the days will come when there will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down." ⁷ And they asked him, "Teacher, when will these things be, and what will be the sign when these things are about to take place?" 8 And he said, "See that you are not led astray. For many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he!' and, 'The time is at hand!' Do not go after them. ⁹ And when you hear of wars and tumults, do not be terrified, for these things must first take place, but the end will not be at once." ¹⁰ Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. ¹¹ There will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and pestilences. And there will be terrors and great signs from heaven. ¹² But before all this they will lay their hands on you and persecute you, delivering you up to the synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors for my name's sake. ¹³ This will be your opportunity to bear witness. ¹⁴ Settle it therefore in your minds not to meditate beforehand how to answer, 15 for I will give you a mouth and wisdom, which none of your adversaries will be able to withstand or contradict. ¹⁶ You will be delivered up even by parents and brothers and relatives and friends, and some of you they will put to death. ¹⁷ You will be hated by all for my name's sake. ¹⁸ But not a hair of your head will perish. ¹⁹ By your endurance you will gain your lives.

We respond to the reading of the Gospel with an acclamation of praise, and then confessing our common, Christian faith.




