

A Walk Through The Gospel of Mark-Each Wednesday we focus on Mark's writings and witness the life of Jesus on earth; how He impacted His followers, and those who came into contact with Him. See page 11 for more information about this Gospel.

Tonight our worship centers around the fact throughout your entire life, God has a plan for you; a unique purpose that He designed with you in mind. The Bible reveals a beautiful plan for our lives. We can know with all certainty many aspects of God's plan because they are revealed in His Word. Other parts we discover as we walk in ever-deepening fellowship with God. P: We gather tonight in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.


C: Amen. We celebrate lives filled with purpose: Lives created by the Father; restored by Jesus Christ and made holy by the living breath of the Holy Spirit.

THE GOSPEL LESSON Mark 8:14-21

¹⁴ Now they had forgotten to bring bread, and they had only one loaf with them in the boat. ¹⁵ And he cautioned them, saying, "Watch out; beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and the leaven of Herod." ¹⁶ And they began discussing with one another the fact that they had no bread. ¹⁷ And Jesus, aware of this, said to them, "Why are you discussing the fact that you have no bread? Do you not yet perceive or understand? Are your hearts hardened? ¹⁸ Having eyes do you not see, and having ears do you not hear? And do you not remember? ¹⁹ When I broke the five loaves for the five thousand, how many baskets full of broken pieces did you take up?" They said to him, "Twelve." ²⁰ "And the seven for the four thousand, how many baskets full of broken pieces did you take up?" And they said to him, "Seven." ²¹ And he said to them, "Do you not yet understand?



- C: Receive our thanks for those who serve us in Your name and bless those who preach and teach Your Word to us, that what we hear we keep in holy hearts and blameless lives.






THE COMMUNION HYMN "Thy Body, Given For Me, O Savior" LSB 619

THE POSTLUDE

The Gospel Of Mark is the shortest of the four gospels, Probably the first gospel written. All but 31 verses are quoted in the other gospels, leading many to conclude that Matthew and Luke used Mark's gospel as source material. The Believer's Bible Commentary notes that because of its brevity, Mark's gospel is an ideal introduction to the Christian faith. In mission fields it is often the first book translated into a new language.

Date According to tradition, Mark went to Alexandria in Egypt where he died in 64 A.D. Barnes suggests the book was written between 56 and 63 A.D., and other scholars date the book in the early 50's. A plausible date would be 57-59 A.D. (Bible Knowledge Commentary).

Theme Mark's gospel was evidently written to Gentiles, perhaps Christians in Rome. Jewish customs are explained - Mk 7:3-4 • Aramaic expressions are translated into Greek - Mk 3:17; 5:41; 7:11 • Roman reckoning of time is used - Mk 6:48; 13:35 • Only Mark identifies Simon of Cyrene as the father of Rufus - Mk 15:21; Ro 16:13 • Few Old Testament quotations are used.

The focus appears to be on Jesus as the Perfect Servant (BBC). Mark emphasizes the deeds of the Lord more than His words (he records nineteen miracles, but only four parables), the deeds of one who "did not come to be served, but to serve" (Mk 10:45). Thus one could say that the theme of Mark's gospel is: Jesus, Servant of Man.

The Sacrament of Holy Communion

As You come to the Lord's Supper, you are affirming with each communicant that Jesus is your Savior and Lord, that with Lutheran Christians, you believe His Body and Blood are present and you desire to serve Him as a dynamic disciple in the fellowship of all believers. Our Holy Communion practice is called "CLOSE" communion, not "CLOSED" communion. "Close" communion invites all those who answer the following questions in the affirmative. We DO seek to help each visitor and member, to prepare for the celebration of the Sacrament. If you have not communed with us before, or if you cannot answer yes to the questions below, please speak to our Pastor or an Elder before communing.

- 1. Have I been baptized in the name of the Triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit?
- 2. Do I believe that I am a sinful human being without hope of eternal life except for God's mercy in Christ?
- 3. Do I believe that Jesus Christ is God's Son and my personal Savior from sin, death, and the power of the devil?
- 4. Do I believe that Jesus Christ is personally present in the Sacrament of Holy Communion with His true Body and Blood?
- 5. Do I intend, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to live a Godly life?

At Messiah, Communion is distributed in a manner whereby the individual cup, followed by the common cup, are offered at the same table. Communicants seated in the left section of the Sanctuary proceed to the altar first, standing behind the usher. Then the communicants in the right section will proceed to the altar, also standing behind the usher. This will provide a prayerful setting surrounding the significance of receiving Christ's body and blood.

A light, alcohol-free wine is offered in clear glasses in the individual trays. Gluten-free wafers are available at the usher table in the back.
