i THE INVOCATION AND OPENING SENTENCES

- P: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen. This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it!

- P: When the children of Israel lived in Egypt and were slaves,
- C: God sent ten plagues upon Egypt to set His people free and give them rest.
- P: When the children of Israel had their backs to the Red Sea,
- C: they saw God part the Red Sea and they walked across on dry ground as He gave them rest from their enemy.
- P: When there was no way out for us because of our sin,
- C: God sent His Son to the cross, that all who believe would have eternal life and rest in that hope.

† THE CONFESSION AND ANNOUNCEMENT OF FORGIVENESS

- P: Almighty and eternal God, You see things from an eternal perspective,
- C: and we see things from a limited human perspective.
- P: You are omniscient, knowing all;
- C: we are but mortal.
- P: In many and various ways You spoke to Your people in the past, using the prophets as Your mouthpieces.
- C: Your people often disobeyed and provoked Your wrath.
- P: When You bid them enter the Promised Land, they would not,
- C: and You denied that generation any rest, sending them wandering for forty years.
- P: Today, in these last times, You have spoken to us through Your Son.
- C: When we fail to believe in Him, and the message of the cross, we put ourselves in danger of missing out on the rest You desire to give us.
- P: We need rest from our enemies,
- C: from the devil, all his works and ways, and from our own sinful flesh.
- P: Forgive us for rebelling against You, Lord,
- C: for the sins of thought, word, and deed. Forgive us; wash us clean in Holy Baptism and the blood of the cross.
- P: I now ask you before God, who searches the heart: is this your sincere confession?
- C: Yes, it is my sincere confession.

In the Confession, we bare our souls before the Lord, admitting our sins and accepting responsibility for the harm they caused in our relationships with God and with each other. (1 John 1:8-9 Rom. 3:23)

The pastor then speaks God's Word to give the forgiveness Jesus won for us on the cross. (John 20:23)

The Kyrie is a Greek word meaning "O Lord." It is a cry to the Lord for help and strength. In ancient times. the crowds would shout, "Lord, have mercy" as the king entered their town. The church has taken over this prayer to greet its King, Jesus Christ, in the church service. As the people long ago expected help from their king, so we Christians expect blessings from our Savior.

- P: Upon this your confession, I bring you Good News from the King of kings Himself. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen. Thank You, Lord, for Your loving kindness and for Your forgiveness.

THE KYRIE

P: In peace, let us pray to the Lord.



P: For the peace from above and for our salvation, let us pray to the Lord.



P: For the peace of the whole world, for the well-being of the Church of God, and for the unity of all, let us pray to the Lord:

"This is the Feast" is based on Rev. 5:12-13.

When we sing the Hymn of Praise, we join the ranks of the angels in heaven and the militant Christian church on earth, lining up behind Jesus to go into battle against the powers of hell itself. One of the best ways to defeat the devil and his legions is to sing praises to God and proclaim Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world, who is now seated at the right hand of the Father in power.

In the Collect, The pastor and congregation greet each other as the angel greeted Mary at her annunciation. (Luke 1:28) The phrase also indicates the special relationship between the pastor and the congregation. We call this prayer a "Collect" because it

collects the themes of the

lessons and puts them into

a prayer.

The First Lesson is taken from a book of the Old Testament, and is found on page 555 in the pew Bible.

THE COLLECT

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Let us pray. Almighty God, You created mankind not only to work but to rest as well. Yet we too often spend our energy and time seeking and working for those things that Satan has set as traps to destroy us. By the leading and guiding of Your Holy Spirit, turn us away from the things Satan has set as snares to take away our rest. Help us recall our true rest and hope is in You alone. This we ask in the name of Jesus, who came to give us rest, who with You and the Holy Spirit is one God, now and forever.

C: Amen.

THE FIRST LESSON Ecclesiastes 5:10-20

¹⁰ He who loves money will not be satisfied with money, nor he who loves wealth with his income; this also is vanity. 11 When goods increase, they increase who eat them, and what advantage has their owner but to see them with his eyes? 12 Sweet is the sleep of a laborer, whether he eats little or much, but the full stomach of the rich will not let him sleep. ¹³ There is a grievous evil that I have seen under the sun: riches were kept by their owner to his hurt, ¹⁴ and those riches were lost in a bad venture. And he is father of a son, but he has nothing in his hand. ¹⁵ As he came from his mother's womb he shall go again, naked as he came, and shall take nothing for his toil that he may carry away in his hand. ¹⁶ This also is a grievous evil: just as he came, so shall he go, and what gain is there to him who toils for the wind? ¹⁷ Moreover, all his days he eats in darkness in much vexation and sickness and anger. ¹⁸ Behold, what I have seen to be good and fitting is to eat and drink and find enjoyment in all the toil with which one toils under the sun the few days of his life that God has given him, for this is his lot. ¹⁹ Everyone also to whom God has given wealth and possessions and power to enjoy them, and to accept his lot and rejoice in his toil—this is the gift of God. ²⁰ For he will not much remember the days of his life because God keeps him occupied with joy in his heart.

The Gradual is from Psalm 119:9-16 on page 512 in the pew Bible.

The Epistle Lesson is generally from St. Paul's letters, and is found on pages 1002 in the pew Bible. We may read through an entire book over several weeks.

THE EPISTLE LESSON Hebrews 4:1-13

fear lest any of you should seem to have failed to reach it. ² For good news came to us just as to them, but the message they heard did not benefit them, because they were not united by faith with those who listened. ³ For we who have believed enter that rest, as he has said, "As I swore in my wrath, 'They shall not enter my rest,'" although his works were finished from the foundation of the world. ⁴ For he has somewhere spoken of the seventh day in this way: "And God rested on the seventh day from all his works." ⁵ And again in this passage he said, "They shall not enter my rest." ⁶ Since therefore it remains for some to enter it, and those who formerly received the good news failed to enter because of disobedience, ⁷ again he appoints a certain day, "Today," saying through David so long afterward, in the words already quoted, "Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts." ⁸ For if Joshua had given them rest, God would not have spoken of another day later on. ⁹ So then, there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God, ¹⁰ for whoever has entered God's rest has also rested from his works as God did from his. 11 Let us therefore strive to enter that rest, so that no one may fall by the same sort of disobedience.

Therefore, while the promise of entering his rest still stands, let us

The Gospel Verse may change weekly.

We rise for the Holy Gospel as we would stand for Jesus Himself, since the Gospel is His living Word to us.

The Holy Gospel is found on page 846 in the pew Bible. ¹² For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. ¹³ And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account.

THE GOSPEL VERSE



THE HOLY GOSPEL Mark 10:23-27

P: The Holy Gospel according to Mark, the tenth chapter.



²³ And Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How difficult it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" ²⁴ And the disciples were amazed at his words. But Jesus said to them again, "Children, how difficult it is to enter the kingdom of God! ²⁵ It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God." ²⁶ And they were exceedingly astonished, and said to him, "Then who can be saved?" ²⁷ Jesus looked at them and said, "With man it is impossible, but not with God. For all things are possible with God."


We respond to the Word of God with an acclamation of praise.

The Sermon Hymn may coordinate with the Gospel lesson, or with the pastor's sermon topic. P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.







