A Word From Pastor Lee

Baptism

Do you remember your baptism? For many of us, the answer is no. Most of us were likely baptized as babies, and while we may not remember the day, we might have keepsakes like photos, videos, certificates, banners, or candles that help remind us of what God did for us on that special occasion.



On Sunday, January 12, the parents of our 3-year-olds gathered together for a "Baptism Show and Tell." They shared mementos and memories of their children's baptisms, reflecting on the significance of that day. This gathering coincided with the celebration of the Baptism of Jesus, observed on the First Sunday after Epiphany. Parents cherished and shared specific memories of their children's baptisms, recalling the joy and gratitude they felt for God's work in their lives.

As we reflected on these memories, I took time to talk with parents about the meaning of baptism and why it's more than a one-time event. Baptism is where God joins water with His Word, places His name upon us, and claims us as His own. What does this mean? It means that God puts His saving Name on us and, through baptism, gives us His gifts as His beloved children and heirs.

What are these gifts? Baptism brings us "forgiveness of sins, rescues us from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare" (Small Catechism, 2017, p. 292). Isn't that incredible? Through water and His Word, God bestows these precious gifts to us by faith. Baptism is entirely God's work. In baptism, we are adopted as His children and made part of His Church.

But baptism isn't just a past event—it's an ongoing reality. It marks the beginning of a lifelong journey of faith. Why? Because we inherit a sinful nature from Adam—a "complete and total corruption of our created nature, resulting in unbelief and rebellion against the Creator" (Small Catechism, 2017, p. 303). Yet, through baptism, something miraculous happens. A "new man" or "new Adam" emerges within us. This "new man" refers to us as restored creatures of God in Christ. Through the washing of rebirth, we are united with Christ, and the Holy Spirit works in us to create new attitudes, desires, and actions (Small Catechism, 2017, p. 303).

As baptized children of God, we are a new creation. Our hearts are drawn to live in ways that please Him. However, the struggle between our old sinful nature (the "old Adam") and our renewed self (the "new man") is ongoing. Even though we are made new, we still sin. But as baptized believers, we are called to daily repentance—confessing our sins to God and our neighbors and turning back to Him in faith.

So how can we remember our baptism in our daily lives? Each time we gather for worship, we begin with the *Invocation*, where we hear these powerful words: "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). Whenever we hear or speak these words, we are reminded of our baptism and all that God has given us through it. Some make the sign of the cross—a gesture first made upon us during our baptism, marking us as redeemed by Christ the crucified.

I encourage you to remember your baptism daily. Remind your family of theirs. Reflect on the truth that God has made you His child, placed His name upon you, and continues to renew you in His grace. May you always live in the joy and hope of your ongoing baptism from God. God bless you all.

The Culmination of Christmas in the Presentation of Our Lord on February 2nd- Luke 2:22-32

On February 2 each year the church celebrates the presentation of Jesus in the Temple at Jerusalem. Ancient Jewish law required that, following the birth of a firstborn male child, the mother must come to the temple after 40 days for purification and for presentation of the child to the Lord. February 2 is the 40th day of Christmas. The presentation of Mary's child, however, was different from most. This was the Christ Child, Jesus, the Savior, the Messiah who had been promised.

This celebration also gives us the Canticle of Simeon," "Nunc Dimittis".




February 23rd-the Seventh Sunday after the Epiphany—We will celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion in both services.

Our services will be filled with "Alleluias" as we prepare to enter the season of Lent on Wednesday. We will look forward to endless "Alleluia" when we celebrate our Savior's glorious Resurrection on Easter.





As Lent approaches, with the Passion of our Lord to be reflected upon and experienced, it is appropriate that music of our heritage, both old and new, be a vital part of it. Part of the

texture of Lent is the use of hymns and songs in minor keys. It is essential to our observance of Lent that our music reflects the moods of reflection, self-examination, sorrow, and confession, as we lift our hearts to our Lord in solemn reverence and gratefulness, for the ultimate sacrifice of His Son on the cross. These songs in minor keys provoke those emotions and facilitate those feelings. Songs such as "O Sacred, Head Now Wounded", "Stricken, Smitten and Afflicted" and "Jesus, In Thy Dying Woes" bring us closer to the time of Christ's suffering and death. Then, on Easter, we change to songs of celebration, in major keys, such as "Christ the Lord is Risen Today", which provoke more joyful feelings and provide the musical release from the emotions of the music in minor keys during Lent. May we savor the way so many of God's composers have written music that brings us closer to our Lord during this emotional time of year, helping us to feel His grace through inspired music.
