# *A Word From Pastor Lee*

## **Confirmation Camp: More Than Fun and Games**

Each summer, Confirmation Camp is one of the most anticipated events on our youth calendar. It's a time for our students to step away from the busyness of life after school is out, unplug from their screens, and spend dedicated time in God's creation. This year at Lake Lavon, our time together was marked not only by fun and laughter, but by real spiritual growth and deepening faith in Jesus Christ.



From the outside looking in, it may have seemed like just another summer camp—games of Nukem flying across the court, a movie, s'mores, and inside jokes that only middle schoolers understand. But underneath all that energy and excitement, something far more important was happening. Our students were encountering God through His Word, through prayer, and through one another.

Each day, we dug into God's Word and Luther's Small Catechism. We talked about what it really means when we say the Lord's Prayer, confess the Creed, or remember our Baptism. And you could see it—the lights coming on in their eyes as they began to understand that these aren't just old church words. They are words that give life. Words that connect them to the Gospel. To Jesus.

Our theme verse for camp was Ephesians 4:32:  
"Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you."

That verse wove itself into every part of our camp experience. Whether it was sharing in worship, learning how to pray using the ACTS model (Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, Supplication), or simply showing grace and care to each other in the small, everyday moments, our students were being formed in Christ-like kindness and compassion. And that kind of formation doesn't happen by accident—it happens through the work of the Holy Spirit.

Each night, we watched "The Best Christmas Pageant Ever" together—yes, the whole movie, over several evenings. And after each clip, we gathered for devotions that unpacked the grace and truth of the Gospel. The story of the Herdman's, encountering the Good News for the first time, became a mirror for our own hearts. God doesn't wait for us to be cleaned up before He loves us—He meets us where we are and draws us to Himself.

And worship... worship was powerful. It wasn't about performance or polish. It was about presence. One of the most moving images I'll carry with me is seeing these students—arms linked, side by side—singing and praying together. In those moments, you could sense the Spirit's work: binding them together, reminding them they belong to Christ and to each other.

I want to thank you—our church family—for praying for these young people, for supporting them, and for making this kind of ministry possible. Please keep them in your prayers. The world they're growing up in is not easy. But by God's mercy, they are being rooted in something unshakable: the Word of God, the Gospel of Christ, and the love of their church family.

This Confirmation Camp reminded me of something I've seen over and over again in youth ministry: when we give students room to step away from the noise and just be with Jesus and His Word, amazing things happen. They grow. They change. And they remind us, once again, that the Holy Spirit is still at work in the next generation.

# A Word From Pastor Detrie

To my fellow saints,

For some reason, I have been drawn back to rereading Psalms as of late, I am assuming that it is our Lord trying to tell me something of which I know it will take me much longer to get than it is supposed to. I will of course read and reread until the lightbulb goes off. I bring this up because the very first Psalm struck me in a way that it hasn't before and so I am moved to share an insight that I have learned with you in hopes that it might be of some benefit to you.

Psalm 1 is very short, only 6 verses, however within these short verses lies great comfort for the Christian. The second verse says: *"but his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night."* How does Jesus sum up the Law in the Gospels? He says that the fulfillment of the law is to love the Lord God with all your heart, mind, and strength and to love your neighbor as yourself. So, meditating on the law is to meditate on love for God and love for others. In other words, we are called to think about where we stand in our relationship with God every day, are we living just for the self or are we seeking to live our life with God next to us in all we think, say and do. We are also called to reflect on whether we are helping those that God puts in our everyday life, lifting them up in our thoughts, words and actions or are we just living for the self. Now I know I mentioned great comfort and that comes in verse 3, where the Psalmist says: *"He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all he does, he prospers."* When we take time everyday to think about who we are and what we do as children of God we prosper in faith and action, our relationship with God flourishes for ourselves, we feel the connection we have to our God through His Spirit. How much more comfort can this give someone? When we reach out to God, not only does he reach down to us, but He also strengthens us, feeds us and makes us strong.

His comfort also comes to us in a promise that we sometimes overlook as well. This promise is revealed to in verses 4 and 5 where those who live for themselves will not be a part of His congregation but will stand before Him in Judgment. Again, how can this be a comfort for us, who live His grace revealed in His Son Jesus? Simple, it serves as our reminder that nothing escapes His sight, all things are under His control, so we do not have to worry about justice in this life, He is our justice, our advocate. All we have to do is enjoy our life with Him, knowing that our faith will prosper, the fruit we bear will nourish those around us. How amazing is that!

When we meditate, or as I put it, be still, quiet the heart and mind, then think about how much God loves you, what He has done for you in His Son Jesus and how He helps you daily through His Spirit, you experience the comfort and peace that only comes from Him. May this Psalm serve as a reminder of God's love for you and the eternal hope we have in Jesus his Son.

They supported VBS preparations and had the unique opportunity to shadow staff members, discovering the heart and effort behind the weekly work it takes to *Share His Light* in our church and community.

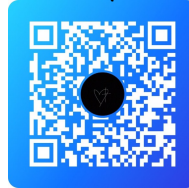

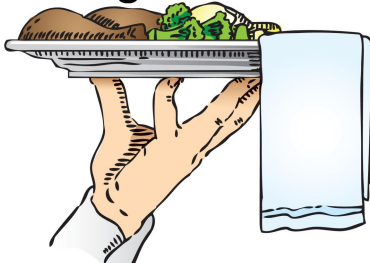
We are still taking the fronts (without writing) on greeting cards to the Denton State School. Please put them on the LWML table by The Lamp Gift Shop.

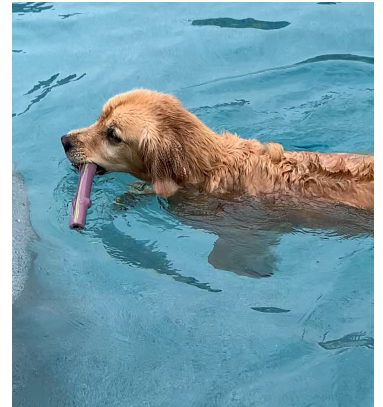


## TRITON COMFORT DOG MINISTRY July 2025
